LEVEL 4 – MAXIMUM ALERT (RED ZONE)

UPDATE REGARDING MAXIMUM ALERT (RED ZONE) WITH CURFEW FROM JANUARY 9 TO FEBRUARY 8, 2021.

January 7, 2021 – Due to the recent changes in the epidemiological situation, all of Québec, except the Cree Territory of James Bay and Nunavik, will be on Maximum Alert (red zone) from January 9 up to and including February 8, 2021.

The Municipality maintains its services continuity plan due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The main purpose of this plan is to provide the human resources necessary to maintain essential services for the population.

❖ **ESSENTIAL SERVICES ALWAYS MAINTAINED:**

- Collection of waste and residual materials;
- Production and treatment of potable water;
- Wastewater treatment;
- Fire safety services and first responders;
- Maintenance of municipal vehicles and municipal infrastructure, including sewers and aqueducts;
- Access, maintenance and monitoring of recreational facilities.
