

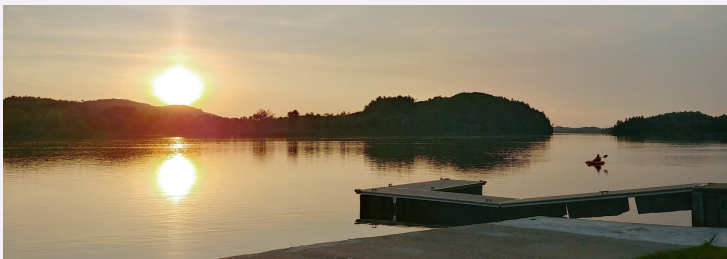

In accordance with bylaw 101-2020 concerning sanitation and nuisances, all property owners must ensure that their property is properly maintained. It's important to keep lawns trimmed regularly, and to avoid accumulating waste or other materials on your property. What's more, when mowing the lawn, we ask you not to blow the grass clippings onto the sidewalks or the street, to prevent them from ending up in the sewer system and causing an overload of solid residues to be treated at our effluent treatment plant - and it's more pleasing to the eye for passer-by and walkers!

DRINKING WATER, A PRECIOUS RESOURCE!

According to the Québec Strategy for Drinking Water Conservation, municipalities are called upon to reduce their drinking water consumption by at least 20% by 2025. Several efforts have been made to date to achieve this, including repairing leaks in the network, but these are insufficient to meet the provincial target. Other measures are currently being studied, including the installation of water meters. However, judicious use of this precious resource remains the best way to reduce consumption. We therefore ask you not to over-consume water, especially during hot spells.

TRANSFER SITE

Our household waste transfer site is open on Wednesdays from 4 to 8 pm (May to September) and on Saturdays from 8 to 4 pm. We accept metal, tires (without rims), recycling, batteries, paint and used oil, electronics and fluorescent bulbs free of charge. Other household waste is subject to a fee, depending on the type. A price list is posted at the site and is available at the municipal office and website.
